

Go to Mass

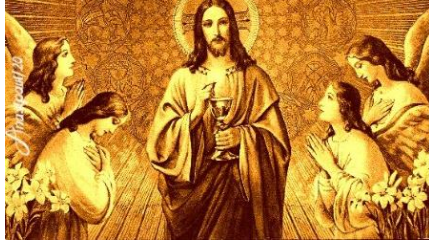
In every Mass, Jesus Christ descends upon the altar in the fullness of His Body, Blood, Soul, and Divinity.

3. TO GIVE THANKS TO GOD

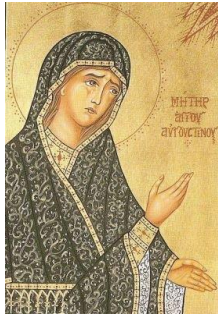
for all the benefits we have received from Him.

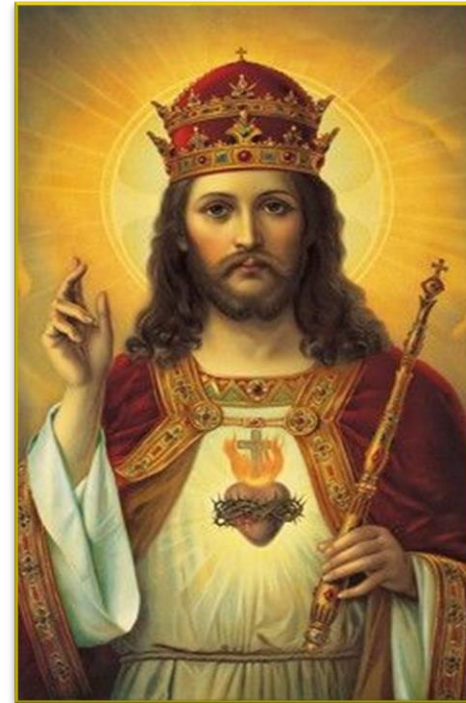

Every day of the year, an event, a devotion, a shrine of Our Blessed Mother is commemorated. During Mary's month, some of these will be highlighted.

OUR LADY OF POMPEII

October 1872: a wanderer on a rather desolate road near Naples suddenly heard a *voice* saying that if he wished to be saved, he should spread devotion to the Rosary, adding that the Blessed Virgin had promised that was the way to find salvation. The man fell to his knees and replied that if this were so, he would be saved; he would not leave the valley until he had popularized the Rosary.

Overcoming the apathy of the locals was challenging but he persisted, and in two or three years quite a group gathered for daily recitation of the prayers.

The bishop, complimenting Mary's devotee on the good work he had done, suggested that a church be built there. Then, turning prophet, he pointed to a field near the chapel and declared that someday a basilica would stand on that spot.

October 1875: our wanderer visited Naples to purchase a picture for the chapel. After several days' search he found, to his great disappointment, that any really good picture would cost around 400 francs. He had nowhere near that amount.

In order not to return empty handed, he reluctantly accepted a secondhand painting from a junk store for five lire. A trucker returning to Naples, not knowing what the package contained, pitched it on top of a load of garbage, and so the picture arrived at the chapel.

The people were pleased with the dilapidated picture and enshrined it. Almost immediately several miracles took place through Mary's intercession. A church was built between 1876-1891 and a new basilica, ordered by Pope Pius XI, between 1934-1939
