“I heard the voice of many angels round about the Throne ... And every creature which is in heaven, on the earth, and under the earth ... I heard all saying: To Him that sitteth of the Throne, and to the Lamb, benediction, and honor, and glory, and power for ever ... And the four and twenty ancients fell down on their faces and adored Him that liveth forever and cast their crowns before the throne,

saying: Thou art worthy, O Lord our God, to receive glory, and honor, and power...”
“Every creature” – angels, men, the mysterious living creatures – *“all saying”* – no dissonance now, no deception possible, no alternative conceivable.
“To Him that sitteth on the Throne,” in the peace and permanence of His own eternity and Omnipotence and Sovereignty and Majesty, King of kings and Lord of lords, *“And to the Lamb that was slain ... benediction, and honor, and glory, and power.”* How faithfully if faintly is this re-echoed when we surround the Throne at Benediction. With our brethren of the Church Triumphant we fall on our faces and adore Him that liveth forever: **Salus, honor, virtus quoque sit et benedictio. To Thee be salvation, honor, blessing, might and endless majesty!**
“They cast their crowns before the Throne, saying: Thou art worthy, O Lord our God” ascribing nothing to themselves, glorying in this, that all they have is from Him and will forever redound to the honor and glory of the Giver.
“Our God!” – what reverence and worship, what love and joy and congratulation the words reveal! There is such pride in Him; such exultation in His triumph. They are so absorbed in His glory; He is so absolutely all in all to them that their very thanksgiving is selfless: “We give Thee thanks for Thy great glory ... Let us be glad and rejoice and give glory to Him, for the Lord our God, the Almighty, hath reigned. Alleluia.”
