Three Scapular Stories
for the Sundays of July,
from a sermon by Bishop Dolan:

2. St Peter Claver, the Jesuit missionary who baptized tens of thousands of African slaves in South America called the scapular the instrument of Divine Providence. If you can just get someone, a non-Catholic even, to wear it, who knows the graces that will follow. A religious priest in New York in the 1940s had all his training in Rome. He was assigned to be assistant chaplain of that big Hospital in Manhattan called Bellevue. The chaplain of the day had to leave, so he said to him, "Father, you're on duty." This was his first day and he prayed that no one would get sick because he was so nervous about what he was supposed to do. Well, pretty soon a nurse came and said, "Father, um, there's a Catholic over here and you need to see him." So the nurse took him to the sick man's bedside. Father asked, "Would you like to go to confession?" He looked at him and he said, "Well, Father I'm not a Catholic." The poor young priest was all confused. He had no idea what to do next, so he went back to the nursing station and said, "I thought you told me he was a Catholic, but he says he's not." "Well, Father," she said, "he's wearing a scapular very decisively." So he goes back and says, "How did you get a scapular?" "Well, there were some nuns collecting for something or another outside my factory and they gave me one of those scapulars and they asked me to wear it so I have ever since." "Well, would you like to be a Catholic?" "Father, I'd like nothing better." And so he instructed him. Four days later later he was baptized and he died peacefully in our Lord.

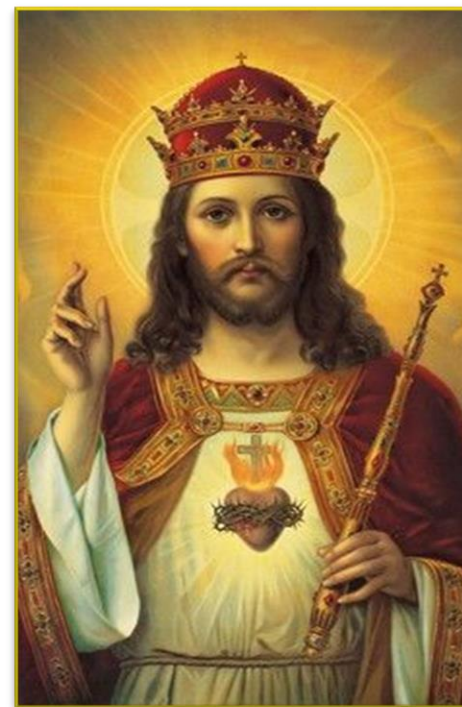

After the Ascension, St Peter committed blessed Mary Magdalene to the disciple St Maximin. When persecution arose, Lazarus, Martha and Mary, Martha's maids, Maximin, and many other Christians were put to sea in a ship without tackle or rudder. By God's providence they came to Marseilles. There, when Mary Magdalene saw the people assembled to sacrifice to idols, she rose up peaceably with a glad visage and a discreet tongue, and speaking well, began to preach the faith and law of Jesu Christ. They marvelled at her reason and her fair speaking. "It was no marvel that the mouth that had kissed the feet of our Lord so debonairly and so goodly, should be inspired with the word of God more than any other."

Desirous of contemplation, Magdalene found a deserted place where she abode for thirty years without knowledge of anybody. A solitary priest dwelling twelve-furlong distant, one day witnessed her being raised into the air by angels. Mary Magdalene spoke to him, confessed the great things Our Lord had done for her, and exhorted him to visit St Maximin in Marseilles and tell him that on the Monday after Easter, at the hour of Matins, he should enter alone into his oratory, and that "by the ministry and service of angels he shall find me there."

St Maximin rejoiced greatly at receiving the message. On the said day and hour he retired into his oratory and saw the blessed Mary Magdalene, surrounded by angels. St Maximin feared to approach to her. She said to him: Come hither, mine own father, and flee not thy daughter. He drew near and beheld her visage, shining as the rays of the sun.

Mary Magdalene received the body and blood of our Lord of the hands of the bishop with great abundance of tears, and after, she stretched her body before the altar, and her right blessed soul departed from the body and went to our Lord. After it was departed, there issued forth an odor so sweet-smelling that it remained there by the space of seven days. The blessed Maximin anointed her body, buried it honorably, and commanded that his body should be buried by hers after his death.
